We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Wattles Park Elementary. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a school not needing an identified label by the State of Michigan.

Wattles Park students, overall, outperformed the state of Michigan averages and averages of similar demographics schools. Our English Language Arts scores were near the same as the state and similar schools' averages. Our math scores were significantly higher than the state and similar school averages.

State law requires that we also report additional information. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

The Harper Creek Community School District has established boundaries within the district to identify what elementary school students will attend based on the location of their residence. Parents residing in or out of the district may submit a School of Choice application to request placement in a different elementary school. All School of Choice decisions are made by district central administration.

Our District Curriculum Council works to ensure the implementation of all curriculum at Wattles Park Elementary. Administration and staff members work together to ensure that curriculum and district assessments are aligned. The district's curriculum is aligned with the state model.
- 4. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Our students took the NWEA MAP assessment three times throughout the 21-22 school year. In math, our KG and 3rd grade student exceeded their expected growth for the year. Our 1st, 2nd and 4th grade students were each with a single RIT point of meeting their expected growth for the year. In Language Arts, Our 3rd grade students exceed their expected growth. Our KG students were within 1 RIT point of meeting their expected growth, and our 1st, 2nd and 4th grade students were more than one RIT point from making their expected growth for the school year. Our 4th grade students took the NWEA MAP Science assessment, and they exceeded their expected growth by over one ROT point for the 21-22 school year.

5. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

During Fall conferences in October of 2021, 91.5% of our students were represented by at least one parent teacher conference. In February of 2022, 89.6% of our students were represented by at least one parent teacher conference.

6. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING: Wattles Park Elementary is a Kindergarten-4th grade school.
